PRE-Renovation Education Program

The Pre-Renovation Education (PRE) Program was established to ensure that owners and occupants of pre-1978 housing are provided information concerning potential hazards of lead-based paint exposure before certain renovations begin in order to prevent adverse health effects from renovation activity.

If you are a home improvement contractor, plumber, electrician, roofer, renovation/remodeler, painter, carpenter, landlords, and/or anyone whose work disturbs two square feet of a painted surface and you are receiving compensation, you need to keep current on federal and state regulations concerning environmental hazards.
